## HOWIT WORKS

SchoolMessenger *only syncs* with PowerSchool <u>after</u> a teacher has recorded the student as absent. Then, there is a time delay (10-15 mins) before SchoolMessenger and PowerSchool communicate with each other.

### SIGN UP HERE

Needing to report an early departure during a block? Because of how SchoolMessenger currently syncs, it is best to contact the school directly

Our automated system contacts parents at 9:35am and 6pm to let you know about unreported absences, lates and early sign outs
